

The Cookworthy Museum asks for your support

Opened in 1972 to give a new lease of life to the seventeenth century Grammar School, the Cookworthy Museum has become:

- An important place of interest to residents and visitors to Kingsbridge and the South Hams. It is one of the larger independent museums in the area.
- A centre of research into the history of the South Hams and the preservation and display of objects of local historical interest. Thousands of people visit it each year, and it is greatly appreciated by many school parties and adult groups.

It was thanks to the English China Clays Company that the Museum was created as a tribute to William Cookworthy of Kingsbridge, the first Englishman to discover china clay and make true hard paste porcelain.

In 1983 the Museum became independent and so has to rely more and more on local support, both for financial aid and for voluntary service. In 1991 the Cookworthy achieved the status of a Registered Museum, followed by Accreditation from the Museums Libraries and Archives Council (MLA), in 2007. This was awarded again in 2013 by Arts Council England.

A £400,000 major capital refurbishment programme was completed in 1999. The Heritage Lottery Fund, English Heritage, the Pilgrim Trust, the South West Museums Council and other grant making bodies, with generous local support, enabled this to happen. In 2002, the Heritage Lottery Fund supported the redevelopment and modernisation of our Local Heritage Resource Centre; and in 2005 a further grant enabled us to improve our disabled facilities, establish a Viewing Gallery and produce our popular 'Virtual Museum Tour' DVD. This was followed in 2008 by a grant to establish a modern gallery, the Duncombe Gallery, where kiosks enable visitors to view the Museum's entire photographic collection of some 16,000 images.

The running costs of the Museum are met by:

- Admission fees, shop sales and rents
- Covenants and donations
- Subscriptions by the Friends of the Museum
- Fund raising events
- The Society is a Registered Charity and has all the benefits this entails.

The minimum annual subscription to the Friends is £5.00, which gives you free admission to the Museum, involvement in special events and regular newsletters. For an additional £5.00, you also gain free admission to the Local Heritage Resource Centre. Life Membership is at present £30.00. If you are willing to give us your support, please complete the form opposite and, if applicable, the Gift Aid Form.

As a Friend of the Museum Society you become a Shareholder and therefore entitled to a vote at the Annual General Meeting of the William Cookworthy Museum Society.

We need many more Friends, not just to augment the income but also to give **voluntary help** in the Museum, as many have done since it opened, to attract more visitors and to improve the services that the Museum can offer to the public. We need stewards to help on Reception and in the Gift Shop, and opportunities may exist in the areas of curatorial assistance, archiving, education, database work, local history research and exhibitions/displays.
